



DERWENT SCHOOL

U.S.S. No. 18 - North Dorchester and No. 21 Westminster

The old Town line school later known as Derwent Public School was built about 1850. Some of the very early teachers were: John Night, Andrew Jackson, Caleb Allen, Veitch, Henery Keyes, Stillman Groat, Luke Jenkins, Mary Allen, Hutchison, Thos. Elizah Allen, Andrew N. Yerex, George Sparling, Robert Flemming, Archibald Black (Duncan Black's father), James McKellar.

The school house was condemned and a new one erected in 1872 on the same property; north west corner of concession 3, Westminster and the town line, now known as Highway # 74.
