4-H Achievement Day Successful ^{May 8/69}

A new 4-H Homemaking Club project, "The Third Meal", made available through the Home Economics Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and Food, has been received with enthusiasm and interest throughout the past few months in Bruce County. Approximately 600 4-H Homemaking Club members in Bruce County have participated in this project, led by 120 leaders. The girls are taught to cultivate good food habits through planning, preparation and service of meals which are nourishing, appetizing and economical. They practiced including variety and new ideas in the third or "lighter" meal of the day as well as making plans for picnics, patio suppers, barbecues and Sunday suppers. In order to practice this they studied the variety of foods available on the market and prepared many recipes using as many different food-stuffs as possible. Each girl kept a Record Book and recorded a variety of recipes which she tried throughout the project.

In the Wiarton area, approximately 100 members participated in the 4-H Homemaking Club Achievement Day held on May 3rd at the Wiarton District High School. All members throughout the morning program took part in judging and giving oral reasons on carried lunches, completing menus to make a balanced diet and planning table settings for a special occasion. In the afternoon program, 11 clubs presented exhibits, demonstrations and skits on numerous topics relating to "The Third Meal". Each member and leader who satisfactorily completed her project receives a sterling silver 5 o'clock spoon and after completing each two projects,

the member receives a Certificate of Achievement.

One of the highlights of the afternoon program was the presentation of County and Provincial Honours to the winners of these prizes. Mrs. Norman Reid, Oxenden, President of Bruce North District Women's Institutes, presented the awards to girls who had completed 6 projects and received County Honours, and to girls who had completed 12 projects and received Provincial Honours.
