Close to \$1,100 was raised by a 15 mile walk-a-thon from Purple Valley to Lion's Head on Saturday June 7th. The walk began at 8 A. M. near the Molvor corner by 115 enthusiastic walkers of all ages, Of the walkers, 75 were from Cape Croker and 40 walked for Purple Valley.

Peter Frouws of Wiarton was the first to arrive at Lion's Head at 10:58 A.M. He was closley followd by Steve Cracknell of Wiarton, Freddie Urbshott of Purple Valley and Rick Hepburn of Wiarton.

Reeve Selby Forbes of Lion's Head was on hand to officially welcone the wlakers to Lion's Head Park.
