To that end, the Lennox and Addington District Women's Institute is holding a Stay Alert! Don't Get Hurt! child safety activity day at Napanee District Secondary School on Sept. 27 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

to 100 and pre-registration is required by Friday, with eight messages, July 18. The cost is \$5 per child or \$10 per family.

The safety day will fea-

ture eight different stations where students from junior kindergarten to Grade 8 can learn a variety of safety skills, organizer Valerie Smith and public relations officer, says.

They will be divided into age groups for the day. "Each station leader knows how to adapt the message to the age group," Smith

Making presentations are the OPP, the L&A Hospital, the NRNF fire department, the KFL&A Health Unit, the humane society, the Farm Safety Association, NDSS physical education department and the Napanee Karate Club.

The OPP will have a display in the parking lot which will include the Baywatch boat. Also on hand will be a fire truck for the children to visit.

Along with these eight stations is an adult information station so parents can accompany their children to the safety day.

"We are encouraging lots of parent participation," Smith says. Parents will have a chance to see displays by the Community Mental Health group and L&A Addiction Services,

among others. The registration is limit-

ed, Smith says, because she wants to control the number of children and minimize distractions. "If they come away with eight

messages, its a successful day," she adds. Smith sees the safety day as an impor-tant one. "It's a very important message for everyone. The children learn how to help siblings and also interact with adults," Smith says.

Students from NDSS will be volunteering to help run the day and Smith hopes they also can pick up a few safety tips to pass on to their family.
