Institute members might arouse the interest of the people in your community as to the value of old letters, newspapers, old documents, and photos, so that these priceless treasures will not be destroyed. For accurate information regarding historical data the following sources may be consulted - your local church, local school, municipal and township council, the public library, Toronto reference library surveyor's maps, the Dept. of Public records and Archives, Toronto. You may obtain information regarding your Post Office by writing to Mr. R.H. MacNabb, Director of Operations, Ottawa. A map of your district or area may be purchased for 25¢ from the Department of National Defence, Geographical Section, Ottawa.

The Tweedsmuir History Books should be made up in the order given in the instructions. This may be obtained from the Loan Library in Toronto.

The order suggested is as follows: The name of Institute, Date of Inception, Date of commencement of compilation, Table of contents, Foreword by Lady Tweedsmuir, Pictures of Lord and Lady Tweedsmuir and Adelaide Hoodless. F.W.I.O. Sec., Mrs. J.H. McCulloch, R.R.2, Brampton at 5¢ each or 3 for 10¢.

Historical Data:

History of Branch Institute; Origin of Name of Community; Geography of the District; Natural resources; Indian information; Pioneer settlements and pioneer families; churches; schools, libraries, industries, newspapers, etc. Improvements in working and living conditions. Pictures and maps with titles names and dates.

Current Events:

War records: - You will want to compile an account of the part your community took in the wars of our country. World Wars 1 and 2. Men and women of your community who were in the armed forces, Women's Institute War Work, Red Cross, salvage and rationing. War industries in your district. Awards and decorations won by the men and women, Honour Roll of casualties, proximity of army camps, air bases, naval stations, Peace celebrations - eventful dates, welcome parties and presentations, names of towns and villages. The
