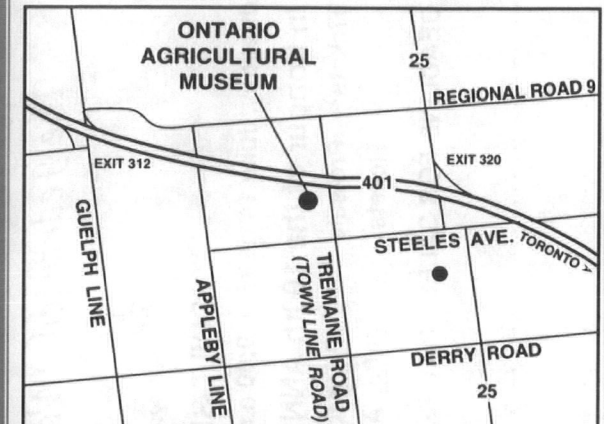

The Ontario Agricultural Museum is an 80 acre site consisting of over 30 buildings and displays. There are three important facets to the Museum that reflect Ontario's rural heritage:

- 1) A series of FARMSTEADS traces the evolution of domestic and agricultural life on the farm:
- 2) The CROSSROADS COMMUNITY features theme buildings which represent services available to the Ontario rural community:
- 3) A series of DISPLAY BUILDINGS exhibit one of the largest agricultural equipment collections in North America
