exported Greening apples to Britain.

When the TH & B (Toronto, Hamilton and Buffalo) Railway was put through, they bought a right of way from the property.

FAMILY of ABRAM and JEMIMA PEW LEE:

MARCUS married Ida Crosthwaite, and Abram bought him the adjoining farm to the south. Marcus was the producer of the Lee Maple Syrup. He joined the Canadian Militia and rose to be Major. His only son Harry Erland Lee was killed at the Somme September 1916. Marcus had three daughters: Ethel was a nursing sister in the First World War, Muriel and Helen.

MAGGIE attended Hamilton Ladies' College where she became a friend of Margaret Chisholm, and it was through this friendship that Erland Lee and Janet Chisholm met. Maggie is credited with chosing the name of "EDGEMONT" for the home -- doubtless because it was built at the edge of the mountain. She, too, was instrumental in persuading her father to build the front two rooms with the high ceilings which were popular in that age. Maggie married Lardner Crosthwaite, brother of Ida.

ERLAND who stayed on the homestead. He married Janet Chisholm and they had 5 children.
