join) and that regular meetings should open by repeating the Lord's Prayer in unison. (For many years these two suggestions were carried out across the Province of Ontario.)

The present 14-room home is nestled among stately pines, on the proposed extension of the scenic drive from Niagara along the escarpment overlooking Stoney Creek and Hamilton, with the blue of Lake Ontario beyond. It is about two miles southeast of King Street East in Stoney Creek via the New Mountain Road, up a rustic drive from Squires' Hall where the first Women's Institute meeting was held. The 'Devil's Punchbowl' is almost 2 miles west.

The small five-room stucco house on the property was built in 1910, and used as a tenant house for hired help.

THE FAMILY :

Marjorie Chisholm Lee stayed at home as her mother was an invalid for sixteen years. At her death in 1940,

Marjorie went to live with her Mother's brother, James Chisholm in Hamilton. Marjorie has lived, in later years at 36 Arcade Crescent, Hamilton.

Hilda graduated from Hamilton Normal School, taught a few years, then went to New York where she trained as a nurse. Her class was the first graduated from the Columbia Medical Centre. She married Herbert Johnson, a Judge of Probate in Connecticut. She died in 1956. There were no children.

Gordon D'arcy was a Lieutenant in the '77th'. He left the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, in his second year to join the forces in the First World War. He served overseas, was wounded, and later returned to the front where he was killed at Lens, May 3rd, 1917.

Alice Paterson Chisholm Lee was the youngest child, and became assistant to her father as Clerk of Saltfleet Township. On his death she became Clerk, a position she held for several years. She married H. Clifford Freel, and, until his death in 1970, lived in their old home above Stoney Creek.

and Vice President

a. Secretary shall have the power of a Managing Director subject always to the approval of the Executive Committee.
