

Historical society presents candlelight tour

The Stoney Creek Historical Society presents its fourth annual Christmas by Candlelight House Tour.

The tour takes in the Erland Lee, Billy Green and Lewis houses from 7-10 p.m. Dec. 12.

Erland Lee was the co-founder of the first Women's Institute. His white board and batten house at 552 Ridge Rd., built in 1873, is of Gothic design and is now a museum meeting centre.

Billy Green was a 19-year-old hero in the War of 1812-14 fought at the Battlefield in Stoney Creek. His home at 30 Ridge Rd. was built in 1820.

The Lewis House at 265 Lewis Rd. was built in 1843 by Levi Lewis, great-great-grandfather of the present owner. The Georgian style pre-Confederation colonial house was home to two early Reeves of the Township of Saltfleet.

There will be music and refreshments during the house tour. Tickets are \$10 each and proceeds will go to the society's museum fund.
