The Mayor would end his tour of Stoney Creek at the Devil's Punchbowl, which offers a beautiful view of the city from the top of the escarpment.

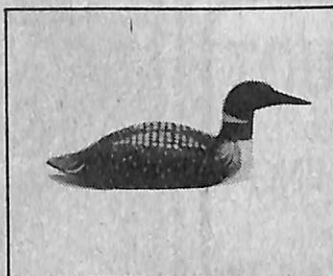

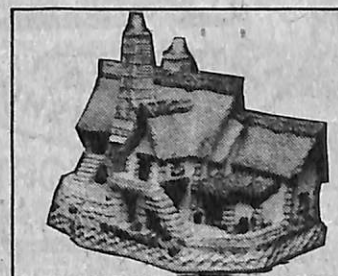
