The celebration of the fortieth birthday will be in the form of a banquet, and one hundred members with their husbands will attend this happy affair. Mrs Thomas Dale is the present president and Mrs. W.N.Langdon is secketary.

Charter members and past presidents will be honoured guests at the banquet which marks another milestone towards a golden Jubilee.
