

## Institute Raises \$1500 For Projects

About \$1,500 was raised last year by the Stoney Creek Women's Institute, the mother institute of the world-wide organization.

Membership increased from 53 to 61 in the last year. Main revenue came from the sale of 300 WI plates, totalling \$600.

Main expenses arose from the 70th anniversary dinner given by members in February with guests from all levels from branch to national.

A \$50 contribution was made toward the building of the electrically-lit cross on top of the Mountain overlooking Stoney Creek. The YWCA building fund received \$25.

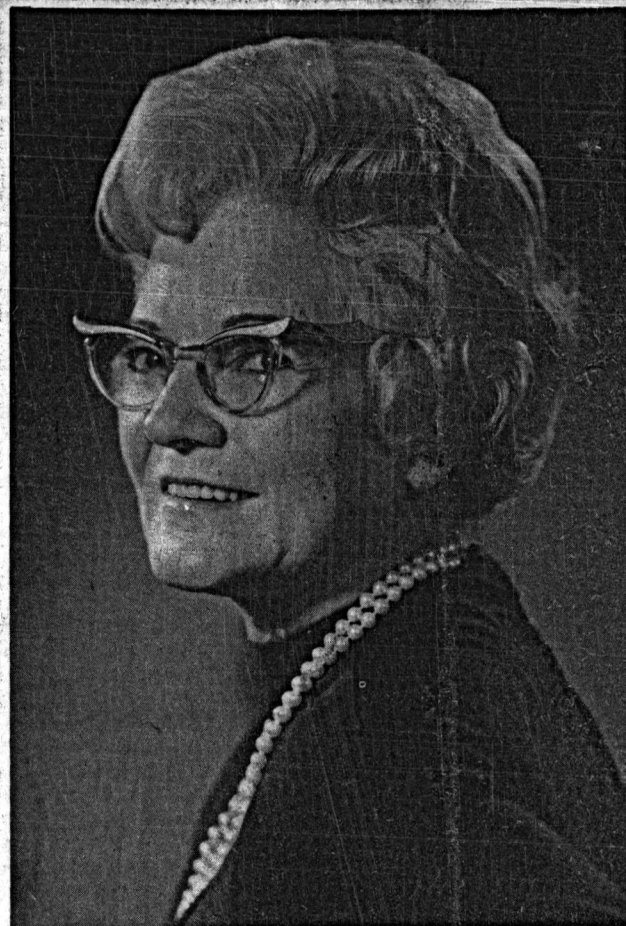
PLANS were discussed for the June Tea to be given delegates from all over Canada who will attend a national convention in Guelph.
