An average of ten members met each week at the home of Mrs R.C. Harris to make cancer dressings. In one year 394 bed pads and 17,400 cancer dressings were made.

Besides the weekly meetings, members made 1 pair flannelite and 4 pairs cotton men's pyjamas, five flannelite nightgowns and one bed jacket for ladies, which were donated to cancer patients through the Cancer Society of Hamilton for Christmas gifts.
