

EXTRACT FROM DEPT. SURVEYOR JONES.

Field notes for the Township of Saltfleet, dated July 1788 ¶.1)

Field notes taken from the original surveys of the Township of Saltfleet, in the District of Gore and in the Province of Upper Canada in July 1788.

Begining at a post planted on the Township Line between Grimsby and Saltfleet at the front of the first concession of the said Township.
