
SENATOR E. D. SMITH IS NOT GOING BACK

Explaining yesterday that he had not, as yet, formally resigned from the Senate, where he has held a seat since 1913, Senator E. D. Smith, of Winona, said that he had not altered his mind about going back and, if a formal resignation is required, it will be sent.

"When I missed two successive sessions," he said, "I thought it would follow automatically that I was out as that is the law. I did not send any resignation as I did not think it was necessary."

The veteran senator repeated his previous statement that he has no intention of going back to Ottawa as he feels that his health does not permit. "I am certain that if I had gone back during the last session, the nervous strain would have knocked me out completely," he remarked.
