Culross Township (1820)
 Culross is called after Culross on the Fifth of Forth, described as "the ancient and decayed burgh of Culross" which was famous for the manufacture of girles, the round iron plates on which the people of Scotland bake their barley and oaten bread. Culross was also celebrated for its salt-pans and coal mines. At the Reformation the possessions of the Cister-tian Abbey, founded in 1217, by Malcolm, Earl of Fife, were con-ferred upon Sir James Colville, who created Lord Colville of Cul-ross. Sir George Bruce, of Carrick, who died in 1625, settled at Cul-ross, where he established exten-sive coal works and carried on the manufacture of salt.
