



The power of this machine is very great, and its action rapid. Secured to one anchor stump in a central point, it may turn upon such anchor, without change of fastening, till perhaps an acre of ground is cleared of stumps, expeditiously and with but slight expense of labour as compared with the work done. The machine is equally well adapted to clearing land of large stones, pulling them from their resting place and lifting them high enough to place a cart or stone-boat under, and then deposit the stone on the vehicle, for removal from the field. It is advantageously employed in the removing of buildings, and in the construction of roads, removing trees, stumps, stones and other obstructions from the route. Machines of different sizes, prices and power, adapted to the draft of two or more oxen, one horse, or even two or three men, are furnished to order.
