

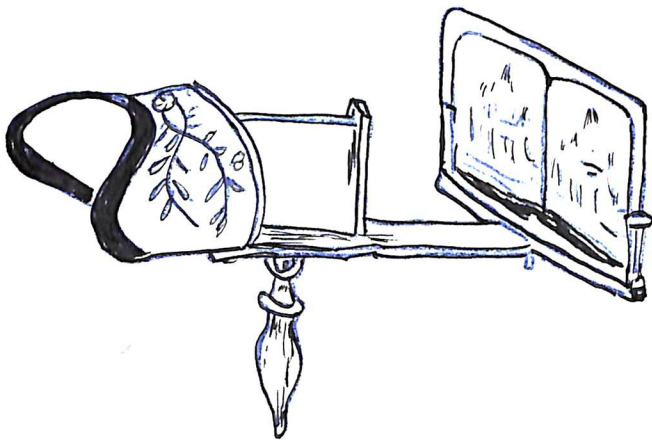
Photography



Glass Pictures were among the first forms of Photography. We have not located any in our community and they would be impossible to mount

These original tintypes are samples of one of the earliest methods of photography

The young ladies pictured are from a "Sills" family - exact generation or the identification is unknown.



Stereoscope

The viewer looked through two lenses in the hood and got a sense of depth - a third dimension - from two identical flat pictures. Optically, one scene became superimposed on the other.

The first stereoscope was developed using mirrors in 1832, but it was not until 1850, after the camera had become common, that the stereoscope and the photograph were combined. By 1863 "the stereoscope was a drawing-room toy" Cost was from .45¢ - .75¢. Sets of views could be purchased for 25¢ for a set of 25.
