

HASTINGS COURT HOUSE, 1839 —Above pillars of 120-year-old Hastings county court house, have already disappeared and court house itself will eventually go under the wreckers' hammer as county administration departments move into new building. court house was built back in 1838 and officially opened the following year. Cost was \$23,000. fan 16/6/

Members of the first Hastings county council back in 1850 were Rufus Holden, reeve and Samuel Stevens, deputy reeve, representing the town of Belleville; Gideon Turner and Caleb Gilbert, reeve and deputy reeve of Sidney; William Sills and William Shorey, reeve and deputy reeve of Thurlow; Alex McLaren and Wellington Frizzell, reeve and deputy reeve of Tyendingaga; George Benjamin, Hungerford; Anthony Denike, Huntingdon Edward Fidlar, Rawdon; Laughlin Hugher, Marmora; and John R. Ketcheson of Madoc township.

On that first county council meeting the credentials of some of the elected reeves and deputy reeves were questioned and it was necessary to adjourn until the following day. On the second day Edward Fidlar of Rawdon won out as warden over George Benjamin of Hungerford, by a 7-4 vote. The following year, however, Mr. Benjamin was elected warden and served in that capagity until 1856
