has a hill of considerable size known as Zion's Hill. A school and a church also bear the name of Zion. Then the cheese factory was built it was also called the Zion Cheese Manufacturing Co.

About 1855 a cheese factory was erected at Halloway. It was one of the first in the County and operated until 1949 when the Company surrendered their charter and sold the factory. About 20 years after the Halloway factory was built the people in this community decided to build a factory. This was in the year 1887. From the old secretary's book we have found the following agreement -

The the undersigned each for himself covenants and agrees to and with the Zion Cheese Manufacturing Company which is to be incorporated by (Letters Fatent) to become members and hereby constitute ourselves members of such company and covenant to take the number of shares set opposite their respective names and pay the price or sum set opposite such shares respectively for the same.

We severally covenant to pay for said shares to the said company as so as it is duly incorporated or as the directors thereof may direct.

Dated at Thurlow this 27 day of October A.D. 1887.

Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of

Witness G. M. Caldwell."

Following directly after this were the names of subscribers and members of the newly formed Company along with their shares and the amount paid.
