24. The Charter of the Company shall be forfeited by non-eeser during three consecutive years at any one time, or if the Company does not go into actual operation within three years after it is granted; and no declaration of such forfeiture by any Act of the Legislature shall be deemed an infringement of such Charter.

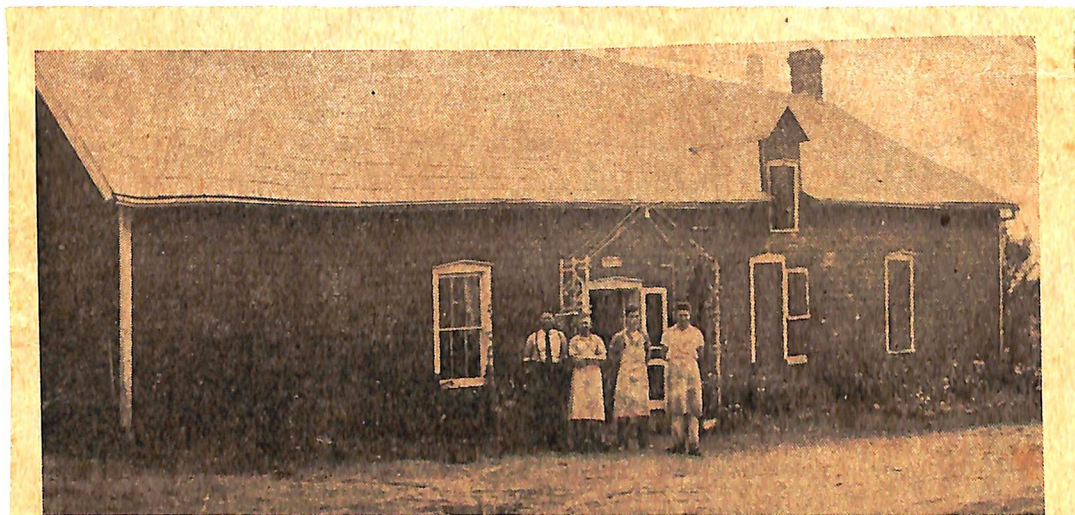
