## Cannifton Garage To Meet Fitzgibbon

Two big games remain before Fitzgibbon Construction winds up their Thurlow Minor Baseball Association tadpole division play this week.

Having defeated Bob's Sport in a total run two game semi-final matchup 25-13, Fitzgibbon moves into a similar two-game playoff final against Cannifton Garage.

But the builders might not come out of the playoff series final the way they did against Bob's Sports.

In an unorthodox method of breaking a third place tie, Cannifton Garage was relegated to fourth spot at the end of the season upon losing a coin toss to Bob's Sports. But as if to avenge the wrong, they came back to edge division pennant winners H. J. McFarland Construction, 28-27 in the semi's.

Winning their first matchup 16-15 and tying the second facing Fitzgibbon which finish-

ed the season in second with a 4-4-0 won-loss-tie record.

Fitzgibbon pitchers, Randy Heggie and Martin Denyes, had to work for their first 8-7 win over Bob's Sport. Combining on a four-hitter, the two hurlers fanned 15 men despite allowing 10 to reach first.

Robbie Kenning snagged two of four hits given up by Bob's Sports pitchers Wayne Peters and Ron Urch. Bryan Beer snapped a three bagger into the outfield to cap singles by Bob's Sports' hitters Philip Walsh, Mike Boomhower, and Urch.

In their second semi-final contest, the four pitchers not only matched arms but hits as well. Denyes partially countered Peters' single and home with his own four bagger, although Heggie's two hits, a triple and double, outmatched Urch's two single contribu-
