Hundreds of TTC tokens found along Highway 33

The Ontario Provincial Police and Toronto Transit Commission are investigating the discovery of hundreds of TTC tokens and over \$300 in loose change along Highway 33 last Thursday.

Const. Mick Chalmers said Ontario Hydro workers made the find while working in the area.


It didn't take long for word to get out and for people to start scooping up the money.

On Friday, Chalmers got in touch with the Hillier Neighborhood Watch, and co-ordinator Gord Morrison was able to get a dozen or so people out to collect the booty.

Chalmers estimates that when the final count is in 1,000 tokens will have been collected and just under \$400 in change.

Chalmers said any money or tokens that have been found can be turned in to the OPP office in Picton or Pleasan-Tree Gifts on Highway 33.

He warns that the booty is evidence and must be turned in.
