

ADELAIDE HOODLESS

Adelaide Hoodless organized the world's first Women's Institute. It was her belief that in this organization rural women could discuss their problems and work together to improve their standard of homemaking and citzenship. The movement spread rapidly throughout Ontario and later to the other Provinces. Mrs. Hoodless, a natural leader and forceful speaker, introduced the teaching of domestic science into Ontario schools and obtained funds for the building of Maddonald Institute at Guelph.
