The 360-page book is divided into seven parts, each giving a substantial look at the glory of the Medieval Kings; the Stuarts; the Hanoverians; George VI; Victoria and Albert; and the Twentieth Century.

It is a long time since this reviewer has so thoroughly enjoyed reading a book, and this is a book that will be turned to time and again, it will become an old friend.
