Original Minutes of the Stoney Creek meeting, Feb. 19, 1897 (To be read by the Branch Secretary)

"Mr. Erland Lee was chairman of the meeting and an address was given by Mrs. John Hoodless. Moved by Mrs. Melson, seconded by Mrs. E. Lee that we organize a Women's Department of Domestic Economy in affiliation with the Farmers' Institute. Carried. It was decided that the name should be the 'Women's Department of the Farmers' Institute of South Wentworth'. The following officers were elected: Honorary President - Mrs. John Hoodless President - Mrs. E.D. Smith, Winona Vice President - Mrs. J.J. Dean, Fruitland Secretary - Miss M. Nash, Stoney Creek Treasurer - Mrs. J.H. McNeilly, Fruitland
