WAR EFFORT

Dedicated members packed Christmas boxes, knitted socks, made pajamas, sweaters, gloves, and jam.

LIBRARIES

They operated travelling libraries, and helped establish other libraries.

HOSPITALS

In a continuing effort to improve community health, the women supported the two hospitals, Picton and the Prince Edward County Memorial Hospital.

MUSEUMS

The women created and donated quilts. They presented displays of village history, donated items to the Educational Museum, and funded special projects.

SCHOOLS

For the schools in the area, the women donated funds for safety signs, flags, First Aid Kits, nurses visits, hot lunches, musical instruments, computers, school fairs, and supported educational trips.

4H, GIRLS & HOMEMAKING CLUBS

Since 1920, Women's Institute provided leaders and funding for various clubs. They developed the Prince Edward District Women's Institute Scholarship for 4H members.

FAIRS

The women donated prize money, entered displays, served tea & cookies, and provided rest areas. They competed in the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair. They provided funds for repairs and new windows in the Crystal Palace.

CEMETERIES

The installation of decorative gates, the purchasing of equipment, the clean up and mowing of local cemeteries were all projects for Women's Institute.

ART & CRAFT SALE

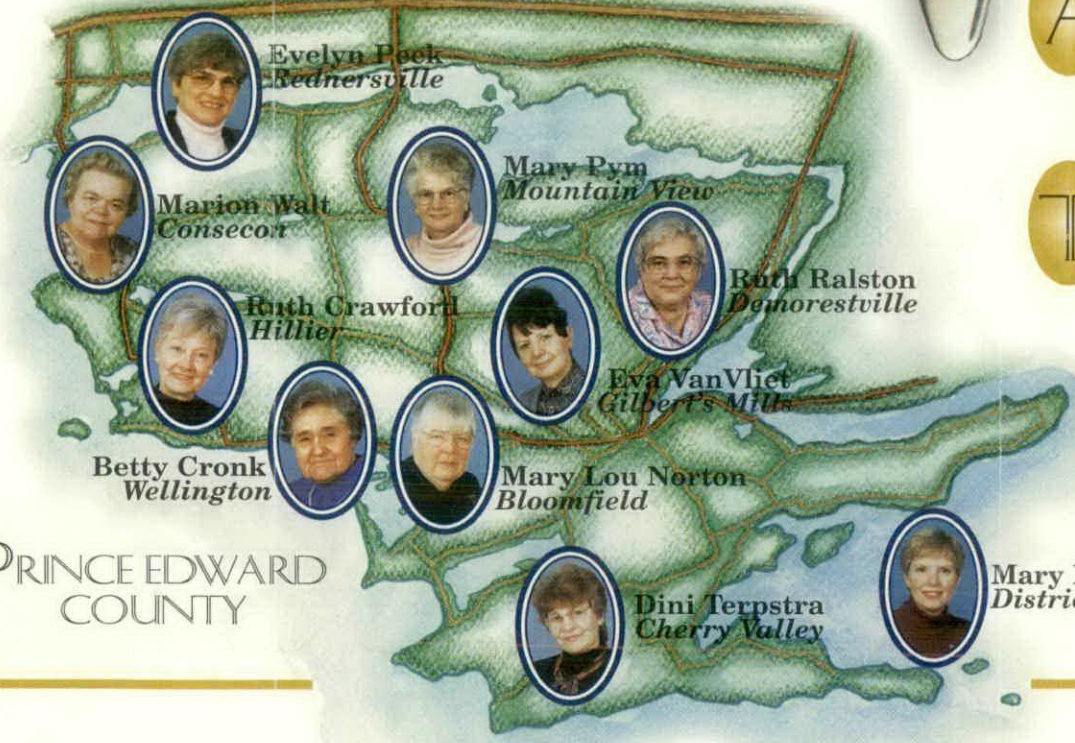
The yearly art and craft sale provides and opportunity for artists to display and sell their work.
