### Livestock saved in barn fire

FAIRVIEW — A cattle barn was levelled by fire here last night on a farm about 10 kilometres southeast of Stratford.

About 50 head of cattle were in the barn at the time the fire was first noticed at 7 p.m. but were freed from the burning structure and were not injured.

The barn was located on the farm of Ken Green, of RR 1 St. Pauls, who operates the farm in partnership with his brother Doug.

The Downie Ellice Volunteer Fire Department from Sebringville were called to the fire and sprayed water on a nearby pig barn to prevent it from also catching fire. A corn crib next to the barn also escaped damage from the fire.

Fire department spokesmen were not available for details this morning but a neighbor who witnessed the blaze said faulty wiring may have been the cause of the fire.
