Mercury plunges to -30 C in city 1984

Temperatures dropped to a bitter -30 Celsius last night, setting a new record for the coldest night of this winter.

Previously, the coldest night of the winter had been Jan. 11 when the overnight low dipped to -26.

The frigid temperatures also caused an unusual phenomenon this morning known as ice fog.

A spokesman for the London weather office said today ice fog occurs in very cold weather and differs from ordinary fog in that it is made up of ice crystals in the air, rather than water droplets.

Another difference is that ice fog deposits hoar frost on outdoor objects while ordinary fog doesn't.
