Farm animals perish 89

EMBRO — A number of animals were killed Saturday when a barn

burned down north of the community of Brooksdale, in the Township of Zorra.

The small barn was located on property owned by Fred Howe, at: Lot 28, Con. 4.

Embro Fire Chief Don Shewan said a neighbor called the fire department around 7:20 p.m., but by the time his men arrived the barn was engulfed in flames and the roof. had already caved in. There wasn't much firefighters could do, said Shewan, except put water on a nearby building and fence so they. didn't catch fire. No one was home at the Howe residence when the fire broke out. The barn housed a couple of horses, a few calves and about 25 chickens, said the fire chief.

The cause of the fire is unknown, said Shewan, and an estimate of damage was not available.
