Gibb reflects on D-Day commemoration

ZORRA — Zorra Township Mayor James Gibb took a few minutes at the council meeting Monday to reflect on the meaning on the 50th anniversary of D-Day.

Gibb, who served in the Oxford Rifle Reserves from 1942-1945, said he remembers the time well. The mayor lost his only and oldest brother in Italy in 1944. He said the special ceremonies marking the 50th anniversary of the Allied invasion on the beaches of Normandy are an important time to stop and reflect on the price paid for freedom. He believes for people who were too young to serve, it is a chance to think about the sacrifices made.

"A lot of people take for granted this beautiful country we have and how it could have a lot different if those men had not laid down their lives," said Gibb.
