## Characters

Mrs. 1897(dressed in old-fashioned clothes typical of the styles worn in 1897.)
Mrs. 1967(dressed in a modern summer dress, preferably a pianafore frock with
no sleeves and low back. wears no stockings and summer sandals.)

## Scene

Mrs. 1897's living room with door opening to kitchen.
Mrs. 1967 sits in a meditative mood - probably with hand under chin.

Mrs. 1967 - I've just been thinking - wouldn't it be fun if one of our dear departed Women's Institute members way back in -- say1897 -- could come in this afternoon and we could have a chat about the changes in the community since that time.

(Mrs. 1897 enters tip- toe from behind a curtain)
