BUILDING USED AS ARMORIES FROM 1913 TO 1950, ALSO USED FOR FAIR EXHIBITS FOR A RENTAL FEE.

BUILDING AND LAND PURCHASED BY TOWNSHIP OF CARTWRIGHT FROM WAR ASSETS COMMISSION FOR \$2000.00 IN 1950.

BY-LAW 922 ON SEPTEMBER 5, 1950 PROCLAIMED THAT ARMORIES BE RENAMED CARTWRIGHT COMMUNITY RECREATIONAL HALL.

IN 1957, THE SHOOTING MALLERY WAS CONVERTED INTO A CISTERN BY CLARENCE MARLOW AND ERNIE SWAIN.

IN 1972 RENOVATIONS TOOK PLACE WITH AN EXTENTION 20 FOOT 6 incheslong and 92 FEET LONG, BUILT ON THE EAST SIDE, CONTAINING WASHROOMS, KITCHEN, COUNCIL ROOM, FURNACE, STORAGE AREA, AND CLOAKROOM, WITH A 9 BY 9 FOOT SEMI-CLOSED AREA AROUND THE ENTRANCE.

RENOVATION WORK WAS DONE BY CONTRACTOR TED GRIFFEN OF PORT PERRY.

ARCHITECTS WERE TOTEN, SIMS AND HUBICKI.

COST OF RENOVATIONS WERE \$40,556.00. A GRANT WAS RECEIVED OF 8,556.00.
