### 11. James Corkery, carver

Jim finds the physical endeavour of creating his mental images in wood contributes to his sense of well-being. His creations express the spirituality that flows from his hands.

#### 12. Judi McWilliams, watercolour artist

She works in watercolours because of the immediacy of imagination. She has sold her works for eight years at the Lynden Gallery in both Cobourg and Port Hope, as well as at the annual Cobourg Waterfront Festival.

13. Heather Spurll,

Using her training as a fashion designer/pattern maker, she has produced a line of heirloom adult night-gowns and children's clothes, using natural fibres.

18. Rick Beaver, painter
