## Woman suffers burns in fire

A woman suffered burns to her hands in a house fire a week ago Tuesday night in a small community just east of Colborne.

The Colborne/Cramahe Fire Department arrived on the scene shortly before 10 p.m. as thick smoke billowed from the eves of the Salem home of the Bartello family, says Chief Gary Cammack.

Mrs. Davina Bartello had been taken to neighbour's where an ambulance attended when the fire department arrived, he said.

She was treated and released from

hospital for minor burns to her hands and The fire origi-

nated in the kitchen but the cause is yet to be determined. After four hours the fire was put out but around 8 a.m. the following morning flare-ups occurred in the roof trusses at 13800 County Road 2. It took about 20 minutes to put it out, said the chief.

In addition to the 22 firefighters from his department another eight attended from the Brighton fire department under the Northumberland County Mutual Aid agreement. The Cedar
