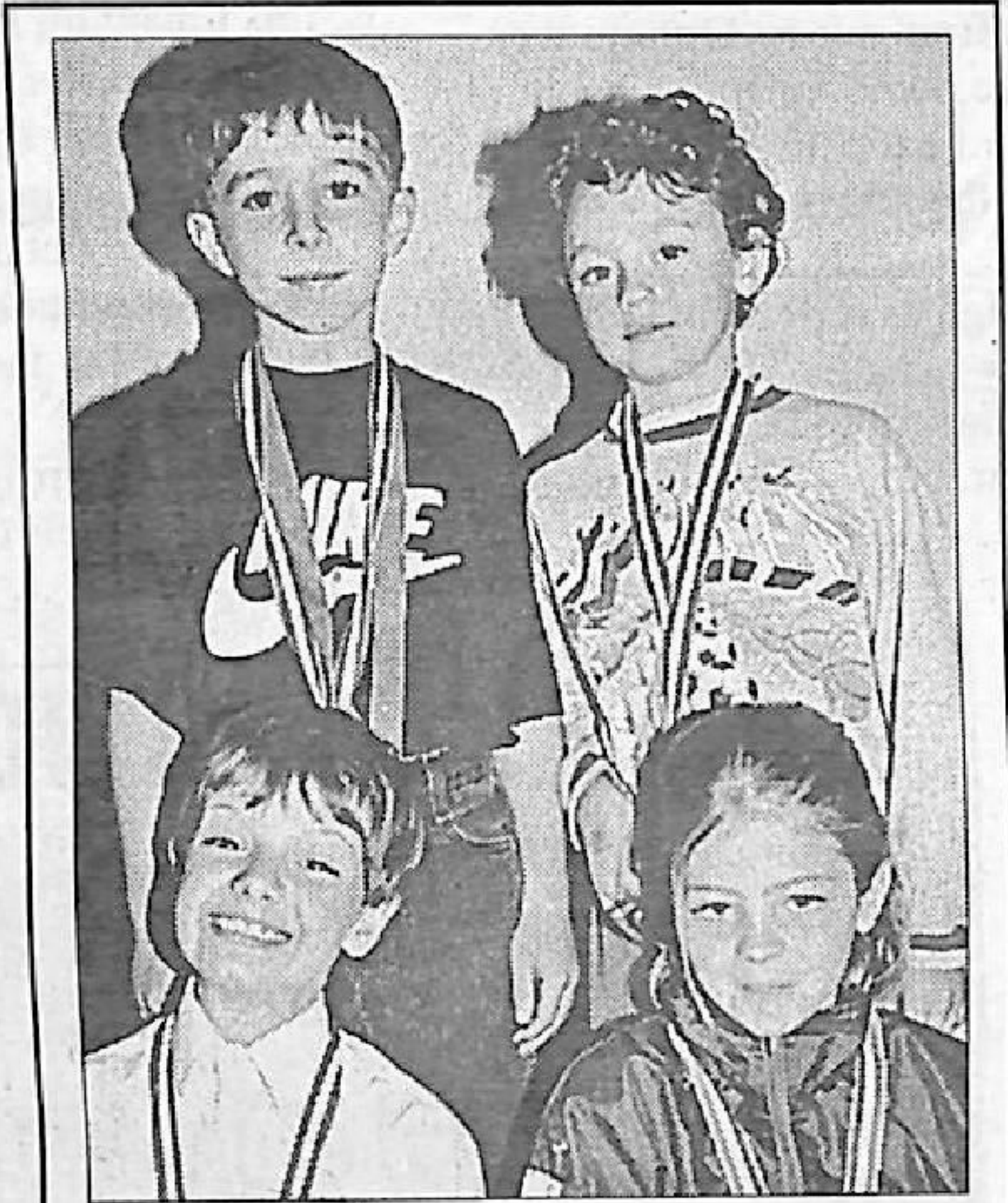

Cramahe building starts on rise

There have been 12 Cramahe Township building permits representing over \$408,000 in value issued for the first three months of '99. Nine of the permits were issued in March.

For the first three months of 1998, the township issued seven permits representing \$540,500 in value.

"It looks like it will be busy this year," Cramahe Township Chief Building Official Joe Bonura reported to the April 19 meeting of township council. "There have already been

more permits issued this month (April)."

The March 1999 permits included four new single, detached dwellings, an accessory building, two garages, one addition and other other home improvement - \$385,500 in value.

For the same first quartile of 1999, four plumbing permits (\$270 in fees), 24 compliance letters (\$1,200), five severance application (\$2,000) and one rezoning application (\$750) have been processed.
