Grafton woman killed in collision

A two-car collision on Boxing Day has claimed the life of a 32-year-old Grafton woman.

Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), City of Kawartha Lakes Detachment, say Jennifer Louise Blight was killed instantly when she lost control of her car on County Road 121, nine kilometres south of Kinmount. Ms. Blight's 21-month-old son, Dylan, a passenger in the car, was transported to Lindsay's Ross Memorial Hospital with minor injuries.

OPP say Ms. Blight was travelling southbound in a 1998 Pontiac, crossed the centre line and collided with a northbound 1999 GMC Suburban driven by Ronald Robertson of Bowmanville.

Mr. Robertson, his wife and three children were taken to the Minden Health Centre with non life-threatening injuries.

As a result of the collision, OPP closed County Road 121 between Kinmount and County Road 9 for five hours.

The accident is under investigation by the OPP Kawartha Lakes Detachment, however investigators feel heavy snowsquall activity in the area was a factor in the collision.

Cramahe Township fire claims life

The identity of a person who perished in a cabin fire in Cramahe Township on December 29 was confirmed on Monday afternoon, December 31.

Deceased is 51-year-old Neil Pritchard, according to a post mortem conducted at the Centre of Forensic Sciences in Toronto. Pritchard died of smoke inhalation.

According to police, a passing resident noticed flames coming from a wooded area south of Dingman

Road at Pogue Road in Cramahe at approximately 6 a.m., last Saturday morning.

Cramahe Township responded to the fully engulfed cabin and quickly extinguished the fire in the charred structure.

Located in the debris were the remains of an occupant.

The Northumberland OPP Crime Unit and the Ontario Fire Marshall's Office are investigating, as the cause of the fire is yet to be determined.
