The volunteer organization has established the Castleton Sports Fields as a top-notch sports venue in Castleton. Two ball diamonds, three soccer pitches, a children's playground, parking lots, ample running space - and all for all ages of participation has been the dream realized by the group of com-

munity volunteers over the past 15 years or so.

Recognizing they were the only resource to establish an activity centre for the rural population, the volunteer parents, community business people, family and friends have continuously pulled together to create and continuously improve the Castleton Sports Fields. Along with the fundraising events have been hours of volunteer physical labour and organizational meetings.

Last fall, the Castleton Sports Club Inc. executive moved ahead with a new canteen building on the site. The new block

building also contains washrooms.

The canteen project is slated for completion this upcoming spring-summer season - all the better to attract tournaments.

"Right now, the township has donated \$1,000 to ensure the programs and, this past year, matched us \$1 for \$1 up to \$30,000 for the new canteen building," Steve Clarke of the Canteen Development Committee reports. "There has been a lot of volunteer labour and many local businesses and tradespeople have donated materials for the project.

"We still have to raise funds to put an awning for shade on

the building. That's the next project."

The Sports Club us warmly encouraging anyone interested in joining their dynamic group to come out to the annual general meeting Tuesday, January 23, 7:30 p.m. at the Castleton Town Hall.

"We'd like to get more of the community involved," Mr. Clarke notes.

As a volunteer organization, there have been dances, bottle drives, selling chocolates, Nevada ticket sales, soccer and ball tournaments, - you name it - for the cause. It's worth noting the only government assistance ever received for the first-rate facility is the annual rec grant from the former municipal council and the special canteen contribution.
