

2002 Cramahe Council member costs reported

What each member of Cramahe Township council spent on conference, training other training costs, plus remuneration for their annual services for the year 2002 has been released. Under the Municipal Act, the remuneration and identifiable expenses are public information.

The three Councillor each received a base \$8,000 as their "payment" for one year's municipal service. From there, the only difference has been in conference and other travel expenses.

Councillor Mike Johnston was compensated \$9,657.27 for 2002 municipal service, \$8,000 set stipend plus \$1,540.13 for conference costs, \$187.25 for training and \$190.69 in travel costs.

The late Councillor Jane Boreham received a total \$9,657.27 of which \$8,000 was the remuneration, \$1,633.82 for conference attendance and \$23.45 for other

travel.

Councillor Ray Kelly was paid \$8,041.65, the basic \$8,000 stipend plus \$41.65 in travel costs.

Mayor Jim Williams receives a basic \$15,000 remuneration for his role as head of the municipality. In addition, he was paid \$1,552.72 for conference costs, \$187.25 for training and \$483.30 for other travel expenses. That puts him at \$17,223.17 total for 2002.

Deputy mayor Lee Dekeyser is entitled to receive \$9,000 per year as a salary from the municipality. However, receipt of those funds would jeopardize a disability pension so he donates those funds back to municipal projects of his choosing. Mr. Dekeyser had \$3,448.59 in conference costs, \$187.25 training and \$548.25 for other travel costs - a total \$4,184.09 - for the year 2002.
