Pie contest inspires cookbook

Warkworth has the Perfect Pie. Now it has the perfect gift, and chances are you'll want to buy this for yourself.

It's a cookbook filled with pie recipes produced by the Warkworth Business Association (WBA) to raise money for its Main Street improvement project.

Containing 185 recipes, both sweet and savoury, Simply Pies offers such old favourites as apple pie but there are dozens of exotic creations as well. Peach Pango Pango, for example, or Jamaican Rum pie. All the recipes were contributed by area residents and their friends.

Meirion Jones, who spearheaded the project, thanked several people involved in the book's production at the official launch of Simply Pies held last Saturday at the Percy Heritage Centre in Warkworth, including Helen King, who baked the cherry pie that graces the front cover, Michel Proulx and Audrey Caryi.

Sale of the book continued after the launch Saturday morning outside the Warkworth Town Hall Centre for the Arts where the 24th annual Perfect Pie Contest was being held. Fourteen-year-old Travis Clarke, RR 4 Warkworth, won the youth category (ages 13 to 18) with an apple pie that was so good that judges named it the Perfect Pie from among 73 entries in all class-

es. It also earned the top bid in the auction of all the winning pies, collecting \$65. Travis must have inherited his cooking skills, because his mom, Heather, was judged to have the best pecan pie.

Barbara Yatsula, of Codrington, won two categories: best savoury and best fruit. Helen King showed why she was chosen to be a part of the recipe book project, winning the apple pie class.

Other winners were: Paige Glover, Warkworth (best chocolate), Kim Raynor (best

meringue-covered), Ian Hartford, Roseneath (best men's), Steven Peters, Colborne, (best maple syrup), Jack Parsons, Campbellford, (best seniors), Alex Grant, Warkworth (best junior), Denise Glover, Warkworth (best filled), and Barb Trotter (the best entry by a member of Warkworth Chapter 279 of the Order of Eastern Star, which hosted the event).
