Terry Fox Run cancelled

There is no one to head this year's Terry Fox Run in Colborne, so it has been cancelled.

That was the word from the Terry Fox Run Chair, Marlene, last Sunday night. Mrs. Harnden confirmed comments made last week by the 2002 and 2003 run organizer, Janice McKnight.

Mrs. McKnight's daughter Mary is being married the weekend before the run, so Mrs. McKnight had to bow out. Mrs. Harnden put out feelers a couple of weeks ago and has had no response, so they decided to shelve the run for this year.

Both women were clearly disappointed that the run, which has been in the village for several years, has been cancelled.

Mrs. McKnight was pessimistic that anyone could pull the run together at this late a date. There are sponsor forms to get out, advertising, and sponsors and race officials to get organized, all before the September 19 run date. She says the help is out there, but no one to lead the team.

Both women expressed the hope that those planning to participate would find another area run to join. This is the 24th anniversary of the run in Canada.

Queen's Hotel mural may soon be gone

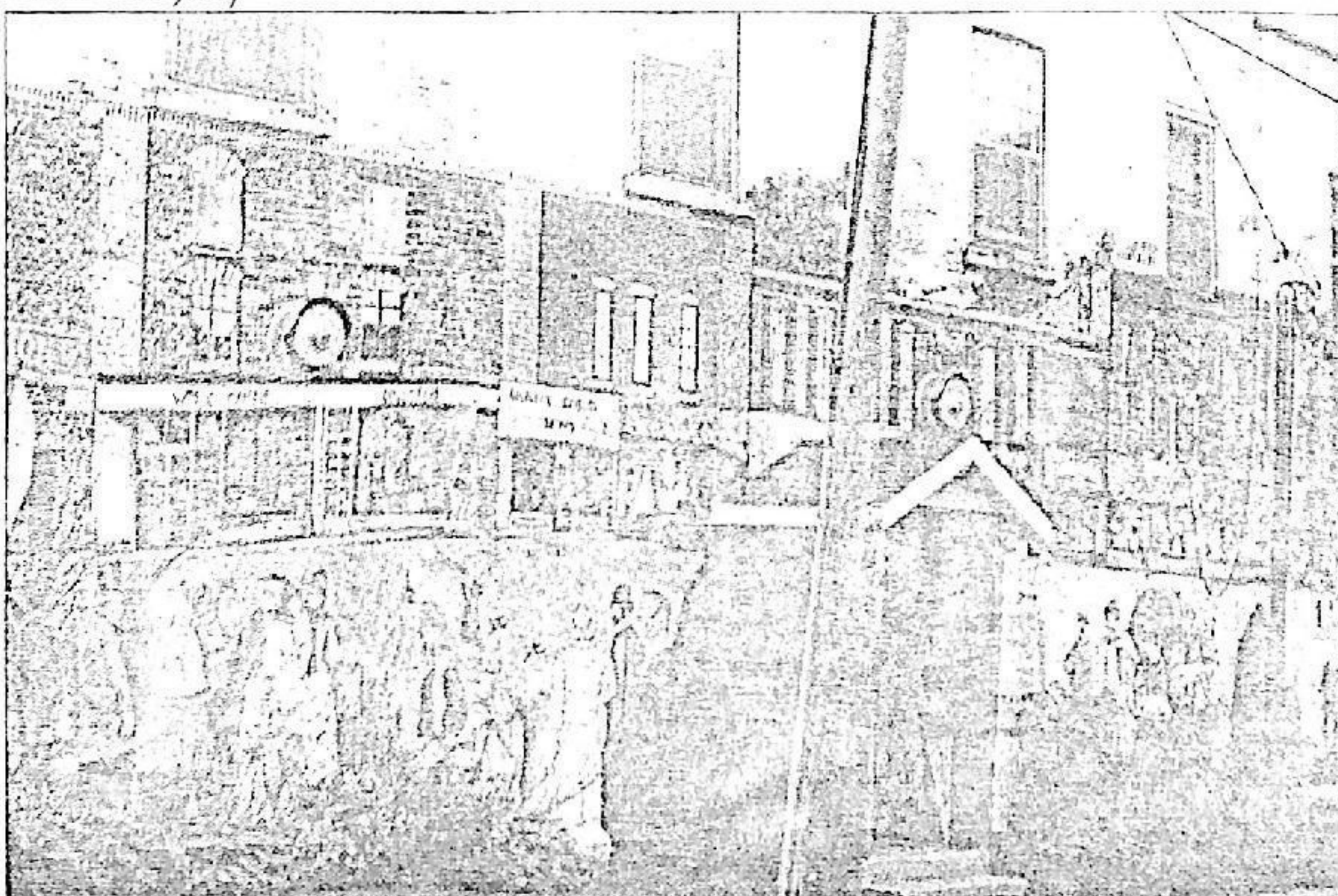

The mural on the west wall of the Queen's Hotel may soon be a thing of the past.

The mural was painted by Norwegian Berg Johnson in 1996-7. He came to the village and liked the building. It took him 3,987 hours to finish the mural which covers almost the entire west wall with a historic scene. Now there are large sections peeling and the mural is scheduled to be removed this year.

Queen's owner, Tim Gilligan claims to have a lifetime contract that he signed with the Village of Colborne when the mural was proposed. That contract states that the Village (now the Township of Cramahe) would maintain it.

Mr. Gilligan is upset that something hasn't been done before now. He claims the Township was to do the work this spring. According to Mr. Gilligan, the Township has agreed to re-plaster



the west wall and paint the building.

Cramahe Mayor, Lee Dekeyser was contacted to confirm what had been agreed but was unavailable for comment.

The Queen's Hotel mural will soon be coming down. The Township has agreed to remove it as part of a contract it has with the owner, Tim Gilligan.

Unrepairable - The mural, created by Norwegian Berg Johnson, cannot be repaired and must come down. Some of the paint is peeling away in large sections.
