## Rita Cowie honoured for knitting bonnets for babies

Rita Cowie's hands are never still - or at least it seems that way.

Cramahe Township resident was congratulated last week by the Castleton United Church Women for the many bonnets she has knit for preemies.

Mrs. Cowie has been knitting the bonnets for newborns since 1991. She says she started when there were preemies born in her family.

And she just continued, dropping them in drop boxes in Guardian Pharmacy stores. At the

same time she would pick up yarn left in the boxes, take it home and knit some more.

She has no idea exactly how many she has made. She's not sure how long it takes to knit one, but she can knit two a night, then assemble them later. Guardian Drugs has given her over 200 stickers as part of its Guardian Angels program. The drug chain provides a book of patterns, but Rita has the basic pattern long with variegated wool; it works out well. And unless she is taking on an intricate pattern, she can do the knitting while she's preparing meals or focusing on other things.

Last Thursday, Rita was presented with a plaque to commemorate her many hours of work. Since 1996 she has been doing the bonnets as a Castleton United Church Women activity, and the group has supplied her with the wool.

When asked where she learned to knit, Rita replies that she comes from a family that knits, crochets and quilts.

In fact, she has decided to take ago memorized. She likes to knit a rest from her bonnet-making and take a course in machine embroidery in Campbellford. She also has some quilt tops ready; and then there's the Shiloh Ladies Group quilt to put together ...
