

Above: It was a time to celebrate, and the musical entertainment was great at the gala performances.

E.N.S.S. REUNION

High school reunion draws alumni from near and far

Those who attended the official opening of the East Northumberland Secondary School time capsule Friday morning found themselves vaulted back to 25 years ago.

While the contents focussed on the school, they also represented all aspects of the community, with copies of local newspapers of the day, a map of the area as it existed in 1980, school records, staff lists, photographs, arts, sports and scholastic achievement and activity memorabilia and more.

In July of 1980, the school underwent a name change to its present title of East Northumberland Secondary School, so the reunion of that year was listed by Brighton native and Trentonian reporter the late Casey Corbett as "a reunion and rededication."
