Little Lake under study


Improving the park at Little Lake is being studied under by Cramahe Township Parks and Recreation under the leadership of Rita Collins.

Parks and Rec will be hosting a public information meeting at the Keeler Centre 7 p.m. July 21, Mrs. Collins announced. At that meeting, input from residents of Cramahe about the improvement of the beach and park is sought.

Mrs. Collins has already met with some of the cottagers to inform them there will be a committee formed to study the park and make recommendations. She invites all interested to join her in this project.

The project is part of the Parks and Recreation Master Plan which was widely lauded for most of its recommendations last year.

POLICE REPORT

Over the long weekend, two 12-hour Northumberland OPP officers focused on traffic and marine patrol violations. In all 167 speeding charges, 10 seatbelt charges, seven liquor charges, two impaired driving, two 12-hour suspensions, five marine offences, 891 driver contacts, seven injury accidents and 13 damage-only accidents were logged.

Shortly after midnight Sunday, Northumberland OPP officers responded to a report of domestic

dispute in Colborne. A 32-year-old male was arrested and charged with assault. He was held for a bail hearing Monday, July 4. No injuries were reported.

Just after 5 p.m. July 3, a vehicle travelling westbound east of Colborne on Highway 401 was clocked at 163 kph on Northumberland OPP radar.

A 32-year-old Brampton man was issued a summons to appear in court August 11.
