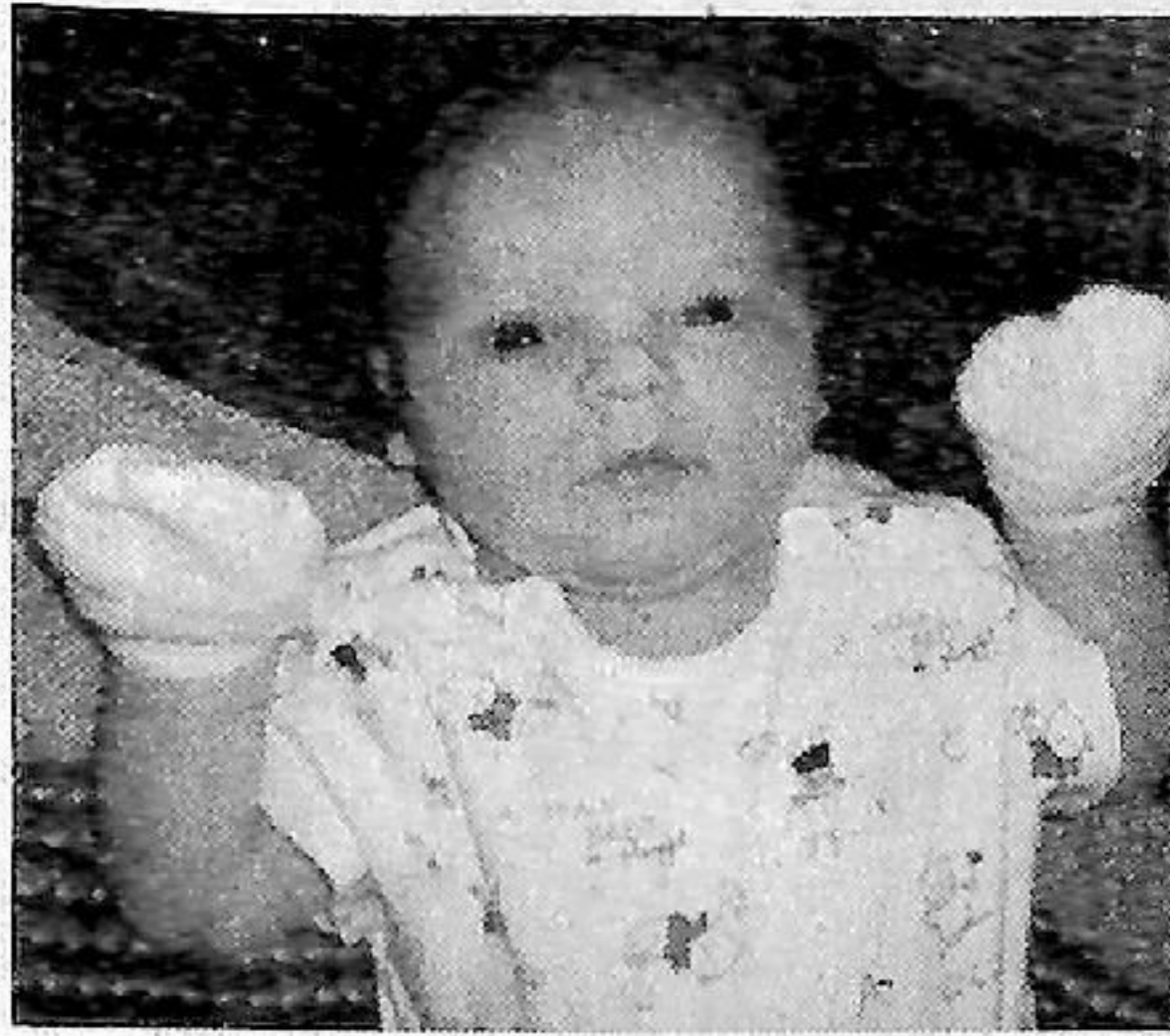

The Concert Band of Cobourg will honour the man who was its driving force for three decades, at a concert entitled *A Musical Tribute to Roland G. White*, on Saturday, March 24.

Roly White is a retired member of the Royal Marines Band Service and director of music emeritus of the Concert Band of Cobourg.

In 1970 he took over the leadership of the Cobourg Kiltie Band, as the band was then called, and built it into one of the finest concert and marching ensembles in the province. He moulded it in the style and department of Royal Marine bands in the United Kingdom.

In 1973 the band was invited to represent Royal Marines veterans in Ontario, and gained the additional title The Band of Her Majesty's Royal Marines Association - Ontario. Every aspect of the band's performance, including its scarlet tunic, distinctive pith helmet and marching style, is Mr. White's legacy to the band, which is now directed by Paul Storms.

In 1997 Mr. White took the band to Germany, where it was part of the official twinning ceremony between Coburg and Cobourg. This is the 10th anniversary of this twinning, and an appropriate time to thank the man who has given so much to Northumberland.
