MOTORCYCLIST KILLED IN CRASH

A motorcyclist is dead following a collision in Castleton on Wednesday morning, June 25. Northumberland OPP say a Volkswagen Jetta pulled out from a private residence on County Road 25 just east of Castleton at approximately 6:50 a.m. when an eastbound motorcycle struck the driver's side of the vehicle near the front tire. The motorcyclist was thrown approximately 40 feet, landing on the pavement. CPR was performed on the person, but he was pronounced dead at the scene. The collision occurred in front of the Castleton Cemetery. The OPP Technical Traffic collision investigators were at the scene and the road was re-opened at 11:30 a.m. The victim has been identified as John Atkinson, 54, of Bailieboro. The lone occupant of the Jetta, a 72-year-old Colborne man, was not injured. The investigation is continuing, and police say charges are pending.

Cramahe gets tourism funding

Cramahe Township has received \$11,100 in funding for local tourism-related activities.

The Apple Blossom Tyme Festival will receive \$1,100 from the Eastern Ontario Development Program through the Northumberland Community Futures Development Corporation.

The Township of Cramahe will get \$10,000 for gateway signage.

Both grants require matching funds from the recipients. Cramahe's \$10,000 share will be jointly looked after by the township and Heritage Cramahe.

Apple Blossom Tyme Festival will receive \$1,100 for enhancement of their marketing campaign for the 2009 festival through portable signs and banners.

The funds will assist in the development of a banner to be hung from one side of the street to the other in the downtown core and more roadside signage to be displayed in advance of the festival to increase visual marketing.

Development of the new signage is to commence this summer.
