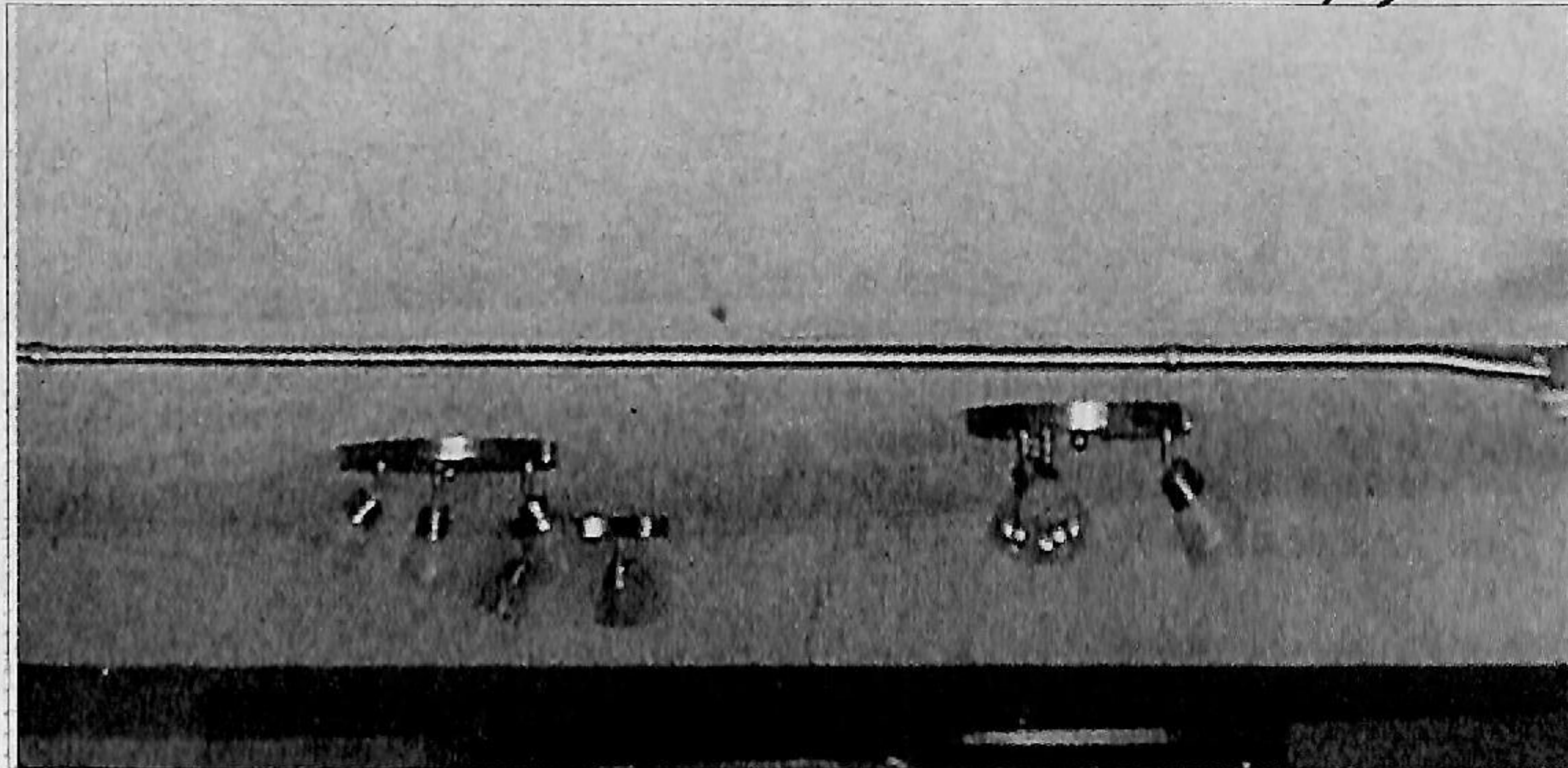
Community Care Colborne issued a press release to inform its clients:
