COMING Thrameter To CANADA

O'Agostino hopes to turn a piece of his family's colourful history into a novel suitable for young people.

The novel, now in its third draft, is based on his great grandfather's life and told in the great grandfather's voice. Len admits he has added narrative and changed the ending but won't divulge much more.

Len can trace his Italian family roots back nearly 400 years and seven generations to Antonio D'Agostino and Cintia Ferri of Picinisco. The records only show Antonio's death in 1706. Cintia was born on October 31, 1663. She was 24 when they married. They had five children.

The trail left by ancestors became more detailed as it moved to a Scottish ice cream shop in the late 1880s. Great-grandparents left Picinisco in 1883 and traveled north, seeking a better life. They wandered, through Italy, France and England playing a barrel organ. When they came north to Scotland, there was nowhere else to go.

For a short time in 1884, Len's greatgrandfather Angelantonio Demarco and his wife Angelina lived in Hull, England, where their daughter Angelina was born. The stay was short and, soon after, they moved north and opened up a small ice cream shop on the High Street of Edinburgh opposite St. Giles Cathedral.

There, a twist fate brought Len's

grandparents together.

The daughter Angelina was married to a Scottish strongman who entered a flour bag-lifting contest in the Waverly Market, won the prize and was carried shoulder-high down Leith Street by his Scottish/Italian friends. Tragically, he soon died from a heart attack.

The pregnant Angelina needed a husband; she and her father headed back to their village of Picinisco, Italy, in search of one. They found Eugenio D'Agostino. The young man had recently finished his military duty. The two young people fell in love, married and went on to have seven children, including Guy – Len's father.

Eugenio followed the Demarco family tradition and, with his father-in-law's support, set up his own ice cream shop at 132 Leith Street.

The young family lived across the street in a tenement with the D'Agostino clan. The two parents worked in the shop and Angelina raised eight children, including Len's father, Gaetano (Guy). Grandmother Domenica D'Agostino joined the bustling family, helping with the family chores.

Ice cream anyone?

Across the street from Eugenio's ice cream shop sat Angelantonio's ice cream shop at 121 Leith Street which was sold to Eugenio's brother-in-law (Angelina's brother) Giovanni fostered a heated competition.
