of War Camp in Medicine Hat,
Alberta. Then seconded by the
Army to help a neurosurgeon at

the medical school hospital in Edmonton, Alberta where he served until the end of the war. Armistice was declared just before he was to be deployed overseas. Dr. Wilson started the first medical clinic in Brighton in the early 1950s.

Sapper

Trained in demolition and working with Bailey bridging in England, Italy, France and Holland with 4th Field Company Engineers, Ist Canadian Divisions. Liberation of Holland. Bailey bridging was creating bridges by assembling floating class 9 boat bridges built on buoys. Two boats to a buoy. One of these Bailey bridges measured over 115 foot span to cross the Ijsel River in Holland. This was

accomplished under heavy enemy fire in record time of 1 hour and 20 minutes. Convoys of infantry, tanks, artillery, etc. were able to cross bridge defeating a huge pocket of German Army.
