Mr. Wright moved back to Canada when his oldest son entered university and has lived in Northumberland County since 1991.

## Warkworth murder trial resumes today

PETERBOROUGH — The jury deciding the case of a 16-year-old boy charged with the first-degree murder of his mother was absent yesterday as lawyers presented legal arguments to Mr. Justice Alexander Sosna.

The boy was charged with killing the 33-year-old Warkworth woman in June 2008. She was last seen at her home May 27, 2008. Her body was found buried in her backyard 16 days later.

Northumberland Today can't publish what was said during yesterday's proceedings because a ban prohibits publishing that information. The trial continues today.
